January Lecture

January 8, 2015 – Wendy Matheson, "Storm at Sea"

Wendy Matheson and her husband owned and ran a graphic design/printing business in San Diego for 10 years. It was a small step from graphic design to quilt design, and Wendy honed her skills on the computer without actually using very much of her growing fabric stash. She began designing and teaching simple, strip-pieced patterns to be used for prayer quilts. Her stash was finally being used at a great rate!

Wendy loves coming up with ideas for improved piecing techniques, and invented a system of cut-after-you-sew tools called Quilters' TRIMplates®. Wendy's specialty is a fast, easy and accurate method for making the traditional "Storm at Sea" pattern without using templates or paper piecing. Wendy's book, *"A New Light on Storm at Sea Quilts: One Block, An Ocean of Design Possibilities"* was released by C&T Publishing in

March, 2009, along with her fast2cut TRIMplate tools. Wendy's newest invention, the fast2mark Easy Triangle tool came out in August, 2012. This little gem is for making half-square and quarter-square triangles with no squaring up.

Wendy will have the tools available at the lecture and will teach her techniques at the workshop! Don't miss out!

NO-MARKING MACHINE QUILTING

by Mary M. Covey

For dark fabric (or any fabric), consider the no-marking method. Trace the quilting design onto tracing paper, pin the paper to a quilt top that's been layered with batting and backing, and then stitch through the paper along the marked lines. The paper is easily removed when you're finished stitching.

Several companies make papers designed specifically for the no-marking method. I recommend Golden Threads Quilting Paper, which comes on a roll and is available in different widths. If you prefer, the no-marking method can also be done using a water-soluble stabilizer.

QIV 2015 "Take Flight" Quilt Challenge

Criteria: each quilt must -

- 1. Must have at least one fabric image of something that flies, not just in the quilting.*
- 2. Have only three colors but may have any number of shades of each color and must have at least one solid (no shades or pattern) piece of material of each color.*
- 2. The colors must be listed on the entry form.*
- 3. May have one neutral - black, brown, gray, or white for an accent color.*
- 4. Be a 20 by 20 inch square.*
- 5. Be entered in only one of the categories - appliqué, pieced, or mixed media.*
- 6. Each category may use only one other category as part of the quilt.*
- 7. Be completed, to be accepted.*
- 8. Be turned in, with this completed form, at the March guild meeting. Voting will be at the April meeting.*

It is time to start working on your entry for next year’s quilt auction. It will take place Sunday, May 3, 2015 at 2 p.m., at the “Quilting in the Valley – Flight of Fantasy” show. The Auction will take place on the outside patio.

Here are the guidelines:

- Only entries made by members of SFVQA or VQG will be accepted.
- Finished quilts only will be accepted. No pre-prints, class samples, pillows, items in hoops, clothing or boutique items.
- Quilts requiring special handling will not be accepted.
- 30% of the selling price before tax will go to Quilting in the Valley.
- The maker receives 70% of the sale price before tax.
- Sales tax will be added to the final sale price of each quilt.
- All quilts must have a label signed by the maker and a hanging sleeve on all wall quilts.
- You must include a minimum bid for each quilt.
- Auction quilts must be turned in at the April meetings of SFVQA and VQG.

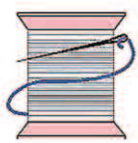
